A gentle, soft-spoken man with a vital interest in the preservation of the Columbia Rver Gorge, Dick Adlard, of Stevenson, came to the Gorge in 1961 as a County Extension Agent for Skamania County. He was instrumental in forming the Skamania County Park Board and was active with youth in the 4-H program. One of Dick's greatest joys was his establishment of the popular Short Course on the Columbia, an educational program that discussed the many facets of the Columbia River Gorge. This course was instrumental in Dick being honored with a distinguished service award at the National Association of County Extension Agents meeting in Richmond, Virginia, in 1976. Among many other involvements, Dick brought his visionary style to the Columbia River Gorge Commission in a 1978 appointment and served on that Commission until the National Scenic Act was passed in 1986.
