Rosa: I was born Feb. 26, 1912 at Underwood, WA. I was born on the 15 acres that my mother and father from my mother's folks, the Bowerlys. Location is on, I think, they call it the Newell Road.

Betty: Newell Road.

Rosa: Is that where you, you know, Betty's children live?

Betty: Of, that's Orchard Lanes.

Rosa: That's ccccc(can't read) Orchard Lane.

Betty: Jones' property now. Now how did they acquire that. Did they buy it or . . . ?

Rosa: No. I was given to our mother and dad by Grandpa Bowerly. I can't think of his first name.

Betty: Oh, Bowerlys was your grandfather.

Rosa: Uh, ya.

Betty: Your mother or father?

Rosa: My mother. My mother's dad.

Betty: OK. Your parents are who?

Rosa: Henry and Christina(sp) Kapp?

Betty: Where they both born here?

Rosa: No. They were born in Germany. One (mother) was born in

Overstenvett(sp) and my dad was born in Guslin, Germany. I really don't know when they came to America, but they came to Underwood from Pendleton, OR.

Betty: 1902?

Rosa: Ya. They were up in Pendleton, Oregon. Then they came here.

Rosa: Part of our children, part of the older children, were born, wher not born here. They were born on the Calligan place down here, you know, where that is, where the wer(sp) come from around here, and when they moved. I'm not sure which of us was first born up there but some of us younger ones were born here.

Betty: How many children:

Rosa: Eight. There are five living, three passed away: Henry, Mc?? and Max.

Betty: Now the, do you know when you parents were married?

Rosa: They were married in Portland, Oregon.

Betty: What date?

Rosa: I haven't the slightest idea. Carl would probably know.

Betty: Oh, and they came to Underwood in 1902.

SOME NOTES BY RUTH STRONG ON THE FAMILY:

Henry and Christina Kapp were married in Portland, Oregon. Henry died Jan. 21, 1930; and Christina died Dec., 1929. Both are buried in Chris-Zada Cemetery, Underwood.

Children:

1. Henrietta. Worked in restaurant in Underwood. Married Fred Godfrey.
2. Heinrich. He was a butcher with his father, and took over the shop when his parents died.
3. Carl. Worked for county on highway dept. and Broughton's.
4. Julia.
5. Max: b. 1910; d. July 5, 1929. Drove truck for his dad, hauling wood, apples and what ever needed.
6. Marguerite: b. Aug. 1911.
7. Rosa: b. Feb. 26, 1912.
8. Maria: b. Jan. 17, 1913.

Max died in an explosion on July 4, 1929, playing with fireworks., putting them in a tank. He died the next day. Then in December mother Christina died of cancer. One month later father Henry died of results o f a heart attack. This was quite difficult for a girl of 18, her senior year in high school.

ROSA KAPP REINLAND b. Feb. 26, 1912; married Andrew Reinland in 1931. He was born June 18, 1911 and died Nov. 21, 1974.

They were married Andrew at the Reinland Brown Cottage, where Carl Rogers, Sr., lives. They moved to White Salmon. They had four children, two born in Underwood; and one in White Salmon hospital and one in Hood River hospital.

Jessamine Ziegler Dies at 88; Was Formerly of Underwood

Memorial services were held Thursday for Jessemine E. Ziegler, former Underwood resident who died in a Vancouver hospital Monday, April 8 at the age of 88.

Mrs. Ziegler was born July 24, 1896 in Taney County Missouri, the daughter of Calvin and Alice Trout. She was married in Oklahoma in 1913 to Emery Marlow and they moved to Underwood in the summer of 1935 after having lived in a number of states throughout the west. Mr. Marlow died in 1936, and Mrs. Marlow was married to Israel Leroy Ziegler in 1939.

The Zieglers made their home in Underwood until 1947 when they moved to Vancouver. Mr. Ziegler died in 1950.

She was a member of the Peace Church of the Brethren in Portland and the Women's Christian Temperance Union.

Survivors include one son, Elvin Marlow of Vancouver; two stepsons, Reno Ziegler and Leroy Ziegler, both of Underwood four daughters, Mildred Denison of Cornelius, Oregon, Toni Thomas of Gates, Oregon, Lily Martin of Scio, Oregon, and Violet Moore of Sturgeon, Missouri; four stepdaughters, Mamie Harris of Winchester Bay, Oregon, Myrtle Hammond of Ojai, California, Esther Brower of Desert Hot Springs, California, and Eva Frasier of White Salmon; two sisters, Marie Walden of McMinnville, Oregon and Orlea Timms of Sheridan, Oregon; 26 grandchildren and numerous great-grandchildren.

Memorial services were held Thursday, April 11 at the Hamilton-Mylan Funeral Home in Vancouver with the Rev. Burton Brown officiating.
